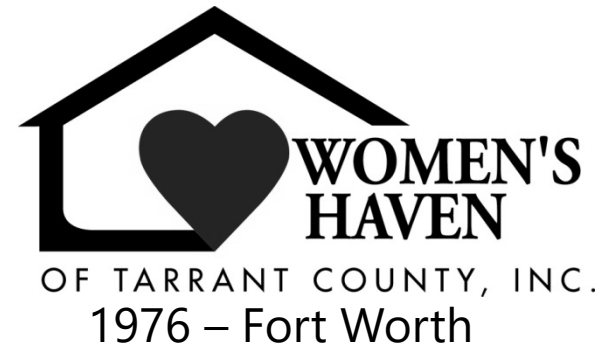
The mission of SafeHaven is: to end domestic violence through safety, support, prevention and social change.

2018 Numbers

- **32** cases staffed by domestic violence high risk team
- **1,322** women and children found refuge in our emergency shelters
- **18,479** emergency hotline calls were answered by trained advocates
- **410** women and children found independence in our housing program
- **22,293** local students received our evidence-based prevention curriculum
- **97** women received legal representation and assistance at no cost
